Reigate town centre is the beating heart of our community and the springboard for a whole range of community based projects that enrich the lives of all who visit and get to know the town. This entry is submitted by The Reigate Business Guild who are a local and voluntary voice from the business community. As well as providing community support between members of the Guild every year we organise the Christmas Fayre involving hundreds of market stalls, carols from local schools, performances Reigate School of Ballet, Donkey rides, and Christmas Lights switch on by a local celebrity. When coupled with Father Christmas arriving by Helicopter in Priory Park you really can't beat the atmosphere in the town.

The Guild also support a number of local charities in the town including www.loveworks.co.uk and www.stripeystork.co.uk In December 2018, Guild Members collected 4 van loads of food to contribute to the Loveworks foodbank. The largest donation of its kind and one that will be repeated in 2019.

We are proud of the retail offer in the town and pleased to see us rise to 12th in the 2019 Vitality Index published in March 2019 by Harper Dennis Hobbs. See report at **Appendix 1**.

Important National events such as Remembrance Day and St George's Day are also recognised and well supported most recently with a digital poppy display projected onto the Old Town Hall and flags lining the High Street.

The Reigate Business Guild Website won the Bronze Award at the Surrey Digital Awards in 2018 and provides an abundance of information for members of the Guild. Our digital presence on Instagram (@reigateguild) and Facebook (ReigateBusinessGuild) also allows us to showcase local events and the successes of our members and local community. A selection of recent Instagram Posts is attached at **Appendix 2**.

Using WhatsApp local traders have created a group dedicated to notifying Guild Members regarding local issues that may have an effect on business.

We carry out a Bi-Annual Members survey using Survey Monkey and attach a copy of the 2017 results at **Appendix 3**.

On the sports and social side Reigate offers a myriad of different sports. Priory Park offers Tennis, skateboarding, croquet, fitness classes, GeoCaching, football, table tennis. Thousands of young people also attend Reigate Priory Football Club, Reigate Priory Cricket Club, Reigate Rugby Club and Old Reigatians Rugby Club.

The Priory Park Pavilion is the first building in the UK to be designed by award winning architect Dominique Perrault who designed the Bibliothèque nationale de France in Paris. Further information about the Park renovation is at **Appendix 4**.

Run Reigate and Ride Reigate have also put the town on the map on a national level. Run Reigate won the Award for Best Half Marathon at the 2019 Running Awards and while Ride Reigate is new to the town in 2019 it sold out in a matter of days and will prove to be a premier attraction for the town.

Heritage Open Days and the Reigate Caves are also a key attraction for the town along with the Reigate Tunnel Beer Festival as well as numerous family events run in Priory Park.

Monthly Reigate Business Guild members meetings are held in a variety of local venues showcasing local businesses and regularly represented by the local police liaison to pass on updates on local policing matters.

Reigate has a number of Pop up shops and event space known as The Yard which demonstrates our innovative side as a town to keep the business premises in full use. The Business Guild also organise a

late-night Christmas Shopping event aimed at increasing footfall and inspiring new ways of keeping business local.

The Guild organise a number of charity fundraisers throughout the year including the Reigate Business Guild Golf Day at nearby Betchworth Park Golf Club and Reigate Business Guild Quiz Nights.

In 2019 three Reigate based companies won awards at the Reigate and Banstead Business Awards. Earlswood Homes took home Large Business of the Year, Crumbs Brewing for Start up of the Year and Pilgrim Brewery for Small Business of the Year. Reigate is steeped in brewing history with Pilgrim Brewery being the oldest craft ale brewer in the south east.


Crumbs Brewing have also taken the innovative approach of teaming up with Reigate based Chalk Hills Bakers to use their left over artisan bread to create their superb range of ales (Rye Ruby, Sourdough Pale and Bloomin' Amber) resulting in the true definition of community based enterprise. Another innovative local business, Inside Out Health, is supporting a local call for opportunities to reduce plastic use by setting up a refill station for household products.

The Folly provides a regular update on local events run by the Reigate Business Guild and showcases the work undertaken for the local community (**Appendix 5**). Our Press Release and poster for 2019 Christmas Fayre appeal can be found at **Appendix 6**.



Q1 How many years have you been a member of the Reigate Business Guild?





Q2 Do you feel that being a member of the Reigate Business Guild provides value for money?





Q3 Do you feel that the Reigate Business Guild does enough to promote and protect the Town?





Q4 Do you attend the monthly Members meetings?





Q5 Do you feel the Members meetings would work better at a later time





Q6 Are you facing any particular challenges in your business? (You can select more than one option)





Q7 Would you support the inclusion of a job vacancies page on the Reigate Business Guild website?





Restoration of Priory Park, Reigate

Much loved town park holistically restored to incorporate facilities for a 21st century public, whilst celebrating the important registered 18th century landscape

The purpose of the project was to transform the core area of this 22 hectare park in the centre of Reigate into a vibrant and welcoming urban oasis, using its heritage as the touchstone of the scheme. By the end of the 20th century, the Priory Park was in very poor condition and offered limited facilities to park users. With an eroded historic fabric and neglected appearance, the park attracted relatively few visitors. Appointed by Reigate & Banstead Council, LUC set out a strategy for the restoration and enhancement of the site to celebrate the history of the designed landscape, while also satisfying the needs and aspirations of contemporary site users. Over a five-year period, LUC worked in a professional and inclusive manner to achieve a completed project which has transformed the site into a vibrant, welcoming and dynamic public open space which celebrates its rich heritage.
